The Board of Directors (the "Board") of Oakmont Public Utility District (the "District") met in special session, open to the public, at Auburn Lakes Recreation Center, the District's designated meeting place inside the boundaries of the District, on Tuesday May 2, 2017 at 7:00 p.m.; whereupon, the roll was called of the members of the Board, to-wit:

All members of the Board were present except Director Bruegger, thus constituting a quorum.

The members of the public who were in attendance are those who provided their name on the attached Exhibit "A".

Also in attendance were: Kenny, of Greater Houston Pool Management, the District's Pool Manager ("GHPMI"); Jerrod Lee, Steven Wright, and Jenifer Cox of The Risher Companies, the District's Recreation Manager ("Risher"); Richard Haddock of Sweitzer and Associates, the District's Landscape Architect ("Sweitzer"); Chris Roznovsky and Diego Burgos of Jones & Carter, the District's Engineer ("J&C" or "Engineer"); and Mallory Craig, Attorney of Coats|Rose, P.C., the District's legal counsel ("Coats|Rose").

WHEREUPON, the meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. in accordance with the posted meeting notice, which is attached hereto as Exhibit "B".

HEAR FROM THE PUBLIC

No comments were presented.

APPROVE MINUTES OF MEETINGS

The Board considered approving the minutes of the meeting held March 22, 2017, which were previously distributed for review.

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Upon a motion by Director Sullivan, seconded by Director Simmons, the Board voted unanimously to approve the minutes of the meeting held March 22, 2017, as presented.

HEAR RECREATION CENTER MANAGER REPORT

The Board recognized Mr. Lee and Mr. Wright, who reviewed the recreation activity throughout the month. A formal report was not presented.

Review and consider approving Amended Pool Rules and Regulations

The Board reviewed and discussed amending the pool rules.

After review and discussion, upon a motion by Director Hebert, seconded by Director Simmons, the Board voted unanimously to approve the pool rules as revised by the comments presented, adopt the Amended Resolution Establishing Pool Rules and Regulations, and authorize the purchase of pool rules signs to be installed at the pool.

Receive proposals for purchase and installation of audio/visual equipment in the clubhouse and fitness center

Mr. Lee presented quotes for the purchase and installation of audio and visual equipment in the clubhouse and fitness center, copies of which are attached hereto as Exhibit "C".

After review and discussion, upon a motion by Director Hebert, seconded by Director Simmons, the Board voted unanimously to: (i) authorize the purchase and installation of audio and visual equipment in the fitness center at a cost not to exceed \$5,000; (ii) authorize the purchase and installation of audio and visual equipment in the clubhouse at a cost not to exceed \$8,000; and (iii) authorize Director Warren to coordinate the purchases and installations with Risher.

Consider Authorizing Summer Classes

Mr. Lee then requested the Board consider options for providing summer classes at the clubhouse for children within the District. Mr. Lee presented a proposal for fencing classes, and requested the Board consider whether to front the costs of the class should the minimum number of registrants not be met. The Board tabled a decision on this item.

Mr. Lee then requested the Board consider contributing \$450 to hold a MadScience summer class for children within the District. After discussion, upon a motion by Director Simmons, seconded by Director Sullivan, the Board voted unanimously to contribute \$450 for MadScience to hold an educational course within the District.

Consider Purchase of Pool Equipment

The Board recognized Kenny, from GHMPI, who presented a proposal for the purchase of necessary pool equipment and pool furniture. The Board reviewed the options and proposals.

After discussion, upon a motion by Director Hebert, seconded by Director Simmons, the Board voted unanimously to authorize (i) the purchase of pool equipment as recommended by GHPMI, and (ii) Risher to coordinate the purchase of 30 chaise pool chairs at a cost not to exceed \$6,000 with final approval by Director Warren of the chairs chosen for purchase.

Amend Clubhouse Rental Fees

Next the Board considered amending the Clubhouse Rental Fees.

After discussion, upon a motion by Director Hebert, seconded by Director Simmons, the Board voted unanimously to adopt the Amended Resolutions Establishing Rules, Regulation, and Procedures for Auburn Lakes Clubhouse, which amended the rental fee for non-residents.

HEAR FROM LANDSCAPE ARCHITECT

The Board then recognized Mr. Haddock, who presented and reviewed the Landscape Architect's Report, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "D". After review, upon a motion by Director Sullivan, seconded by Director Simmons, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Landscape Architect's Report as presented.

HEAR ENGINEER'S REPORT

The Board recognized Mr. Roznovsky, who presented the Engineer's Construction Progress Report, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "E".

After review and discussion, upon a motion by Director Hebert, seconded by Director Simmons, the Board voted unanimously to (i) approve the Construction Progress Report and (ii) authorize the Engineer and Landscape Architect to coordinate with Texana to begin recoating the splash pad water features.

HEAR DIRECTOR'S REPORTS

The Directors provided their reports. No action was taken.

HEAR ATTORNEY'S REPORT

The Board then recognized Ms. Craig, who presented the Attorney's Report.

Approving Towing Agreement and purchase of signs

Ms. Craig then presented a private property towing agreement with Milstead Wrecker Services. Ms. Craig reviewed the terms of the agreement, including that the District will not be charged for the towing services, unless a vehicle is improperly identified for towing. Ms. Craig requested the Board approve the agreement and authorize execution thereof, including authorizing the purchase of the statutorily required towing signs. Upon a motion by Director Sullivan, seconded by Director Simmons, the Board unanimously approved the agreement and authorized execution thereof, including authorizing the purchase of the statutorily required towing signs.

Call Canvassing Meeting

Ms. Craig then noted the District is required to canvass the results of the Directors' Election during a statutorily defined period. Ms. Craig recommended calling a canvassing meeting to be held prior to the next regularly scheduled meeting, which would comply with the canvassing requirements. The Board then called a special meeting to be held May 11, 2017 at 6:30 pm to canvass the results of the election.

HEAR FROM THE PUBLIC

No public comments were received and the public comment period was then closed.

There being no other business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned.

Item A. Master Park Plan

-Sweitzer + Associates is presenting an amenities improvements Master Park Plan draft & estimates of probable costs for review. From this May 2nd meeting S+A will prepare conceptual design plans and finalize estimates of probable costs at the Districts "Town Hall" residence meeting to be held Wednesday May 24th.

Item B. Arburn Lakes Recreation Center Improvements

- Contractor: Texana Builders Inc.

- Contract Date: March 9, 2017,

- Construction Status: Construction is in progress, Sweitzer + Associates is reviewing contractor's submittals and addressing RFI's as needed as well as visiting job site when requested.

- No pay estimates to approve for at the May 2, 2017 meeting - Pay Estimate No. 1 has been submitted by Texana Builders and was reviewed by Bill Sweitzer May 1st. Estimate will be recommended for approval at the Boards regular District meeting May 11th.

Discussion Items:

- Change Order Proposals: Texana has brought it to our attention that the pool deck by the old entrance should have two deck drains installed as to minimize the amount to sheet flow of water across the proposed and existing pool decking. The change order request is for two deck drains installed at \$500.00 total addition to the contract. Sweitzer + Associates will recommend approval at the May 11th regular meeting.

- S+A received Harris County comments for Fire Code compliance; turn around drive is not to code for Fire Access H.C. recommendation is to install fire hydrant maximum of 150' from fitness pavilion. S+A is working with Jones & Carter for adding a fire hydrant along W. Rayford.

Action Items:

- No action items to report with the Recreation Center Project.

- I. Pool Completion: May 13, 2017
- II. Fitness Center Expansion Completion: May 13, 2017
- III. Pavilion Substantial Completion: June 6, 2017
- IV. Final Completion: June 19, 2017

Work Completed Since April 14th:

- I. Pool
 - a. Half of the required concrete panels were poured.
 - i. The remaining panels were not poured due to work site mobility and potential drain installation locations.
 - b. The permanent entry fencing is being roughed in.
 - c. Detail grinding has commenced on the plaster and "Kool Deck".
- II. Fitness Center Remodel
 - a. The concrete slab was poured.
 - b. Began rough finishing the floor.
 - c. Contractor has been waiting for the concrete to cure. Work in the fitness area is set to recommence April 27th.
- III. Pavilion
 - a. Poured the concrete piers.
 - i. Steel reinforcement spacing and sizes were confirmed to match what was required in the construction plans.
 - ii. Concrete test results are expected back from the testing lab next week.
 - b. Began installation of the under-slab plumbing.
 - c. Began re-routing the electrical feeds for the existing lights from under the proposed slab to outside of the slab in new conduits.

Scheduled Tasks for Next Two Weeks:

- I. General
 - a. There are no foreseen items that will affect the construction schedule.

II. Pool

- a. The remaining concrete panels will be poured by mid next week.
- b. The installation of the additional surface drains will be completed, if required.
- c. Large areas of the "Kool Deck" will begin to be removed at the beginning of next week.i. Protection to prepared areas is needed to minimize any potential rework.
- d. Preparation of large voids for plaster work will commence April 27th.
- e. Replacement of tiles and coping damaged during construction will be completed last to ensure additional damage does not occur.
- f. Installation of the paving stones between the two pools will be completed immediate before the pool opens.
- III. Fitness Center Remodel
 - a. Demolition of the existing ceiling.
 - b. Frame up the exterior walls in-between the columns.
 - c. Install the rough electrical items inside the framed in walls.
 - d. Extend the HVAC duct work to the proposed fitness room expansion.
 - i. The duct work will not be put into use until the room is completely enclosed.
 - e. Enclose the building envelope.
 - f. Install new ceiling.
 - g. Install flooring.
 - h. Finish electrical and plumbing.
 - i. Paint and finish interior of building.
 - j. Coordinate the installation of the fitness equipment.
- IV. Pavilion
 - a. Install the concrete pad finishing formwork.
 - b. Install under pad utilities. (Electrical)
 - c. Install and compact sand base for concrete pad.
 - d. Install reinforcing steel for the concrete pad and grade beams.
 - e. Pour concrete pad and grade beams. (3-5 day cure time)
 - i. Concrete pour is scheduled to be completed by mid-next week.
 - f. Construct the wood framing for the building.
 - g. Rough in the wall plumbing and electrical.
 - h. Install the roofing system.
 - i. Enclose the building.

Items to be Discussed & Potential Issues:

- I. Pool Cracking
 - a. The minor cracking will be grinded off and covered by the proposed plastering system included in the contract.
 - b. No cost or schedule impact.

- II. Pool Deck Drains
 - a. The landscape architect is evaluating adding additional drains in the decking to improve surface drainage.
 - b. Cost impact to be determined.
- III. Pool Water Feature Recoating
 - a. We are working with the landscape architect to obtain quotes for the recoating of the water features in the splash pad area.
 - b. Cost and schedule impact to be determined.
- IV. Fitness Center
 - a. Risher has requested two additional ceiling fans be purchased to replace the existing fans in the fitness center so all match. The landscape architect is reviewing the request.
 - b. Risher has recommend a new paint color for the fitness center to improve the look. The final paint colors have not been selected and can be considered at a later date.
- V. Rain Delay
 - a. Pool
 - i. Estimated 2-day delay.
 - ii. The contractor has taken steps to make up for lost time.
 - iii. The plasters began work a few days ahead of schedule with the detail grinding.
 - iv. This time should be able to be made up with dry and overcast weather.
 - b. Fitness Center Remodel
 - i. Estimated 10-day delay.
 - ii. The concrete pad pour was postponed to coincide with the pavilion piers.
 - iii. A majority of this time should be able to be made up once the building is enclosed. Extra attention will be required to ensure quality is not compromised to make up for the delay.
 - c. Pavilion
 - i. Estimated 2-week delay.
 - ii. Delay caused by weather and additional work required to prepare site for community events.
 - iii. Once the building is enclosed the contractor can attempt to make up for the lost time.
- VI. Fire Code Compliance
 - a. It is our understanding the landscape architect is working with Harris County on obtaining fire code approval. The addition of a fire hydrant may be required.
 - i. Cost and schedule impact to be determined.
